1. Close of electoral roll - Federal election

From the announcement of the federal election on Sunday 15 May to the close of the electoral roll at 8pm Monday 23 May, a total of 9,073 Territorians enrolled or updated their enrolment details. Included in these enrolment transactions were 454 eighteen year olds.

The following table shows a breakdown of NT enrolment by age group.

3. Draft remote voting schedule

The [draft remote voting schedule](#) is now available on the election website. A more [detailed PDF version](#) of the draft schedule is also available.

There are seven Election Day Voting Centres (EDVCs) included in the remote schedule as they are staffed by remote teams. These voting centres are at Alyangula, Borroloola, Galiwinku, Nhulunbuy, Tennant Creek, Wadeye and Wurrumiyanga. These will also appear on the list of EDVCs provided separately in this newsletter.

6. Health and lifestyle expo

Darwin High School hosted their inaugural annual Health and Lifestyle Expo on Monday 30 May 2016. The NTEC had a stand at the expo encouraging Territorians to enrol for the upcoming Territory election.

The Expo provided students with a platform to interact with local community health services and government organisations and helped raise awareness of issues impacting young people.

A number of students stopped by the NTEC information stand and enrolled online using the Commission's Surface Pro tablets connected to the internet. Students aged between 16 and 17 took the opportunity to provisionally enrol in readiness for voting when they turn 18 and a number of 18 year olds enrolled for the first time.
