Image 01: Chan ward is highlighted in purple

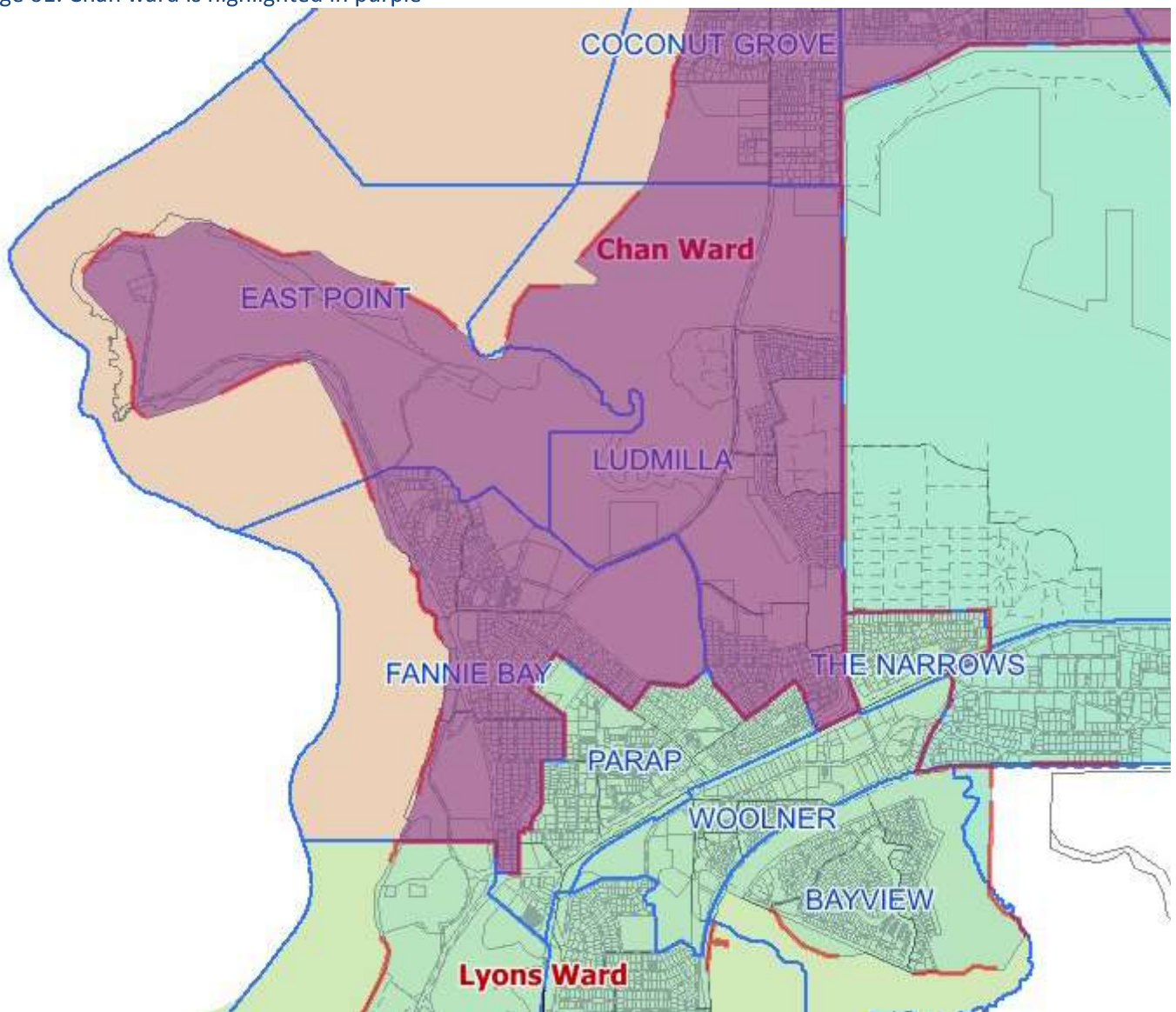
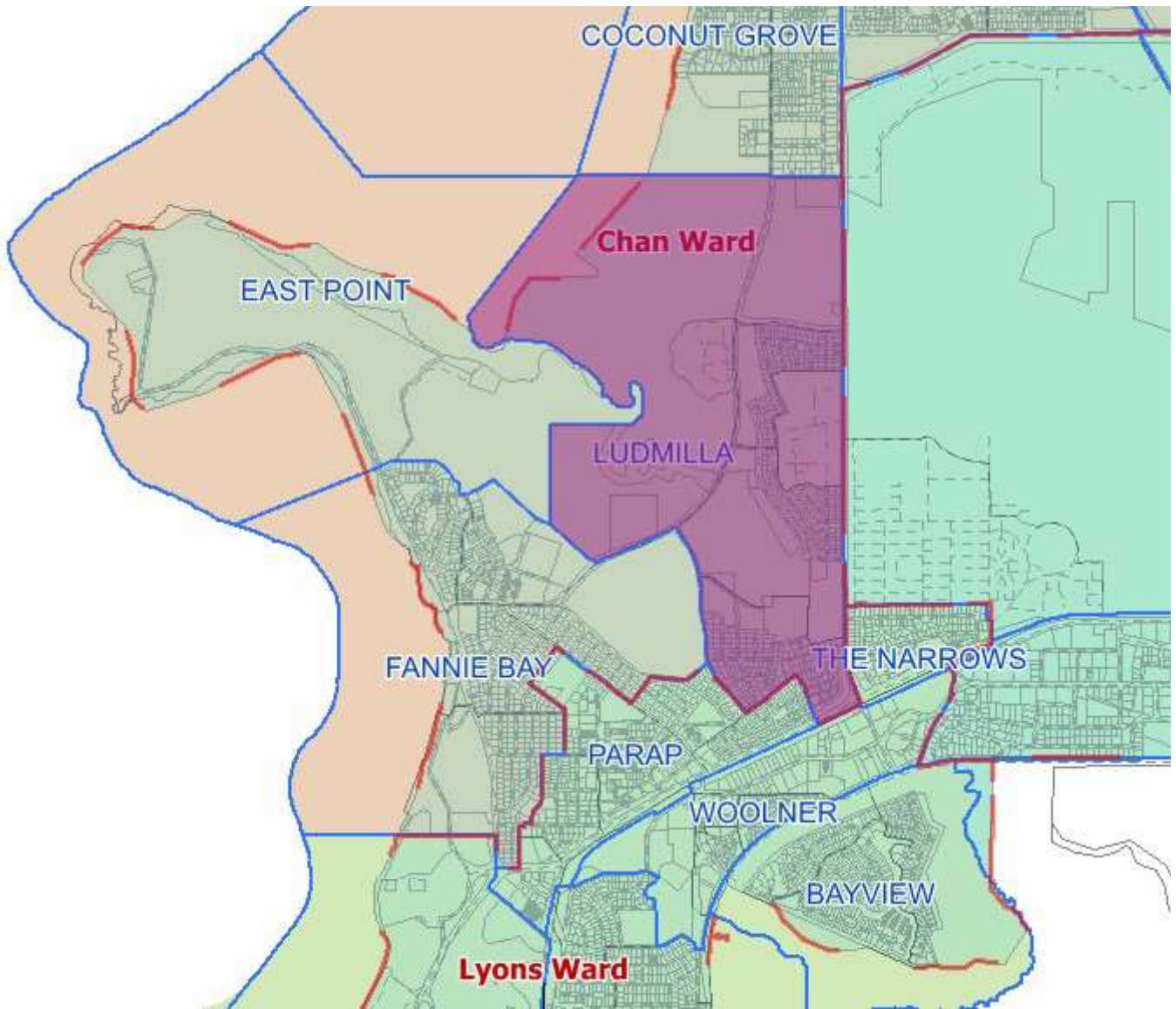


Image 02: The suburb of Ludmilla is highlighted in purple
