Definition of a third-party campaigner

Part 2, section 3 of the [Electoral Act 2004](#) (the Act) defines a third party campaigner as a person who or entity that incurs or expects to incur more than \$1,000 of political expenditure* during the capped expenditure period (1 January to 30 days after election day), but does not include a candidate (as defined in part 10 of the Act), a registered political party or an associated entity.

* Political expenditure is expenditure incurred in promoting or opposing a candidate (within the meaning of part 10 of the Act) or a registered political party.

Application process for registration of a third-party campaigner

Part 9A of the [Electoral Act 2004](#) (the Act) specifies the application process for registration of a third-party campaigner.

Important: Third-party campaigners must register for each general or by-election. This is because third-party campaigners are not ongoing participants in the electoral system in the same way that registered political parties and associated entities are. Under section 175B of the Act, registration must be received by the Commission no less than five days before the relevant election (the Commission will refuse to register an applicant if the application is received within five days before the election).

Section 175M of the Act stipulates that the Commission must keep a register of registered third-party campaigners in respect to each election. The Commission must make the register available on the NTEC website.

Offences

Under section 175R of the Act, it is an offence if a third-party campaigner:

- intentionally fails to register for an election
- incurs more than \$1,000 of political expenditure in relation to an election.

Maximum penalty: for an individual - 200 penalty units or imprisonment for 12 months or both
 for a body corporate - 1000 penalty units

Additionally, it is an offence if a registered third-party campaigner does not notify the NT Electoral Commission of changes to information in the register within 30 days of the change.

Maximum penalty: 10 penalty units

Note: If the Commission believes that information given by a registered third-party campaigner has changed, the Commission may give written notice to the campaigner requiring them to comply.
